4. Symbols of Strengths:

Check out the list of strengths below and note the ones that you feel describe you. Look at the examples of the symbols that could represent these strengths. Use the list or come up with some of your own, and write down those that you might want to feature in your designs, for example e.g. a sun to represent your positive attitude.

Leadership:

- A captain's hat to symbolise being a leader of a team or group.
- A small crown to represent leadership and authority.

Creativity:

- A paint palette with colourful splatters for creativity.
- A thought bubble to represent creative thinking.
- A lightbulb to represent innovation Confidence: & problem-solving skills.

Compassion:

- A pair of hands offering a heart to symbolise caring for others.
- A heart to depict a kind and empathetic nature.

Curiosity:

- A magnifying glass to depict curiosity and exploration.
- An open book to represent a love for learning.

Kindness:

• A bouquet of flowers to depict act of kindness

Humour:

- A clown face to depict a talent for making people laugh.
- A laughing face emoji to symbolise a great sense of humour.

Teamwork:

- Puzzle pieces coming together to symbolise the power of teamwork.
- Two hands clasping to symbolise collaboration and teamwork.

- A superhero cape flying in the wind to represent a "can-do" attitude.
- A thumbs-up to represent a positive attitude.

Optimism:

- A rainbow symbolising hope and positivity.
- A sun peeking over the horizon to represent a bright outlook.

Empathy:

- A heart-shaped Earth to symbolise caring for the world.
- Hands holding a heart to symbolise caring for others.

BADGE CREATION

Now that we've had a solid brainstorming session, you can move on to the tutorials and get started creating your badge designs. You will have the choice of using pen and paper, Procreate or another drawing app of your choice.

You will use the answers from this worksheet you to create your 3 designs.

Word / Animal / Symbol

Your Power Words: Refer back to Question 5, here we'll be using your selected words to master Retro Handlettering to create your badge.

Your Inner Animal: Refer back to Question 3, we'll be illustrating your animal in the super cute Kawaii style for your next badge.

3 Symbols of Your Strengths: Referring back to Question 4 we'll be learning about icon design to illustrate a symbol for another one of your strengths.

Top Tips to remember:

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- Keep it Simple and Clear: In a small design space like a badge, simplicity is key. Use clean lines, bold colors, and easily recognisable symbols to ensure that your message is conveyed clearly and effectively.
- 2. Choose Symbolic Representations: Think creatively about how you can use symbols and icons to represent your strengths and talents. Symbols can be more powerful than words and can communicate a lot in a small space.
- 3. **Use Colours to Express Emotions:** Colours can evoke different emotions and moods. Pick colours that reflect your personality and the message you want to convey. Contrasting colours will make your badge pop.
- 4. **Effective Text :** For badges with text, keep it brief and legible to ensure it is an effective design.
