# JUMPSTART *creative prompts*

## Stretch your creativity & think outside the lines!

From drawing challenges to design exercises, these ideas will help inspire and develop your skills.

- **Draw with your eyes closed:** This activity encourages you to let go of perfectionism and embrace your creativity. Close your eyes and draw an object from memory. When you're finished, open your eyes and add details and colours.
- **Sketch your favourite character** from a movie or TV show in different styles.
- **Choose a random word** & draw a scene or image that comes to mind when you think of it.
- **Design a logo** for a made-up company or product.
- **Create a mood board** in Canva for a dream holiday, using photos and design elements.
- **Use the symmetry tool** in Procreate to create a butterfly or other symmetrical design.
- **Illustrate a tiny world** inside an everyday object.
- **Mashup:** Take two unrelated objects and merge them together in a design e.g. a cactus and a bicycle, a robot and a teapot.
- **Draw in Procreate with a different brush** than you usually use, and see how it changes your style.
- **Choose a colour** and challenge yourself to create a design using only shades of that colour.
- **Draw a portrait of your pet** or an animal using an unexpected colour palette.
- **Reimagine your favourite animal** as a fantasy creature.
- **Turn your name** into a creative logo.
- **Draw yourself as a character** in a video game.
- **Design a postcard** in Canva from an imaginary planet.

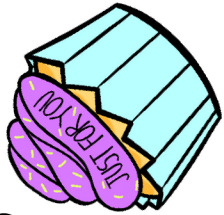

# CREATIVE SPARK

## CHATTERBOX



1. Print and cut around the outside of the Chatterbox
2. Fold in Half and then in half again.
3. Open out, turn over so the blank side is facing you and fold each corner into the middle,
4. Turn over and repeat, folding each corner into the middle.
5. Fold in half and then in half again (with the numbers on the inside), ensuring folds are pressed well.
6. Keep folded in half and slide the thumb and finger of one hand behind 2 of the pictures. Gently work your fingers into the centre points and fold the paper until the 2 points meet.
7. Repeat with the other hand until all 4 points meet in the centre.
8. All the pictures should now be at the front with the centres touching.
9. Your Chatterbox is now ready to use!
